WHAT IS FLUX

FLUX is an open-source chronological photography publishing and archival system. Every 50 photographs automatically becomes a new issue.

The system generates:

- PDF publication
- contact sheet
- metadata manifest
- original JPEG files
- digital archive update

STEP_01

CAPTURE

CAMERA: compact digital camera

FILE TYPE: small JPEG

COLOR MODE: high contrast black and white

PURPOSE:

- eliminate processing
- eliminate workflow friction
- maximize speed

STEP_02

SELECT

GENERATE DIGITAL CONTACT SHEET

REVIEW SMALL THUMBNAILS ONLY

MAKE FINAL SELECTIONS
FROM CONTACT SHEET VIEW

SELECT QUICKLY

DO NOT:

- overedit
- oversequence
- overanalyze

TARGET: 50 PHOTOGRAPHS PER ISSUE

UPLOAD

DRAG SELECTED FILES INTO:

/FLUX_UPLOAD/

RUN:

./flux_update.command
OR: python3 flux_update.py

STEP_04

SYSTEM AUTOMATION

SYSTEM AUTOMATICALLY:

- detects new photographs
- reads timestamps
- preserves chronological order
- generates derivatives
- creates metadata
- generates SHA256 hashes
- rebuilds manifests
- updates digital archive
- rebuilds timeline
- uploads archive online

OLDEST TAVERN

What is Philadelphia's oldest tavern, operating under the same name and at the same address?

Answering such a question is always risky but McGillin's Old Ale House, located at 1314 Drury st. for 186 years, seems to hold that honor. William McGillin opened the establishment in 1800 in a single house. His original license is still displayed there. In those days tavern licenses were issued by the courts. Now, of course, they are issued by the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board.

It wasn't long before McGillin had to enlarge his ale house and it was expanded to two adjoining properties. His family lived upstairs. While the tavern was originally called the Bell-in-hand, people as often spoke of going to "McGillin's," and soon McGillin's Old Ale House became a popular gathering place for celebrities from the literary, sporting and theatrical worlds. 1801 his widow, mother of 12 children, carried on the business until her death on April 4, 1837. During Prohibition the bar was shut down but reopened to bigger crowds than ever in 1933. Every November 12 brought hundreds of old friends to Drury st. with birthday felicitations for Mom McGillin. To each she gave a white carnation. On her 89th and last birthday 4000 carnations were distributed.

Mrs. Mercedes McGillin Hooper, a daughter, carried on the family business at 1314 Drury st. with the founder's grandson, William E. Dougherty, serving as manager, until the spring of 1938 when she sold the tavern to Joseph Szecepaniak. He and his brother Henry have kept the old name and maintained the founder's genial atmosphere at the original premises.

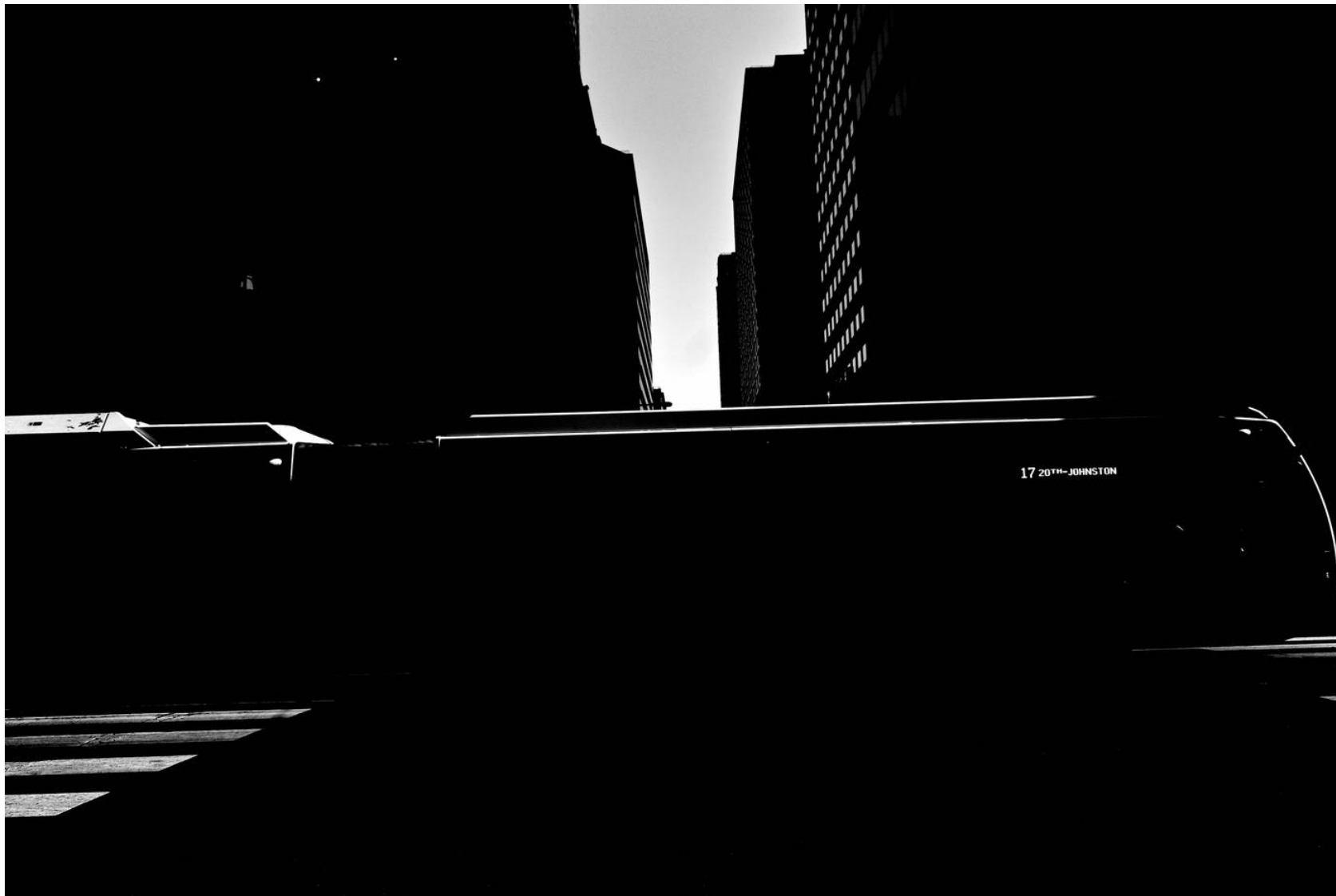

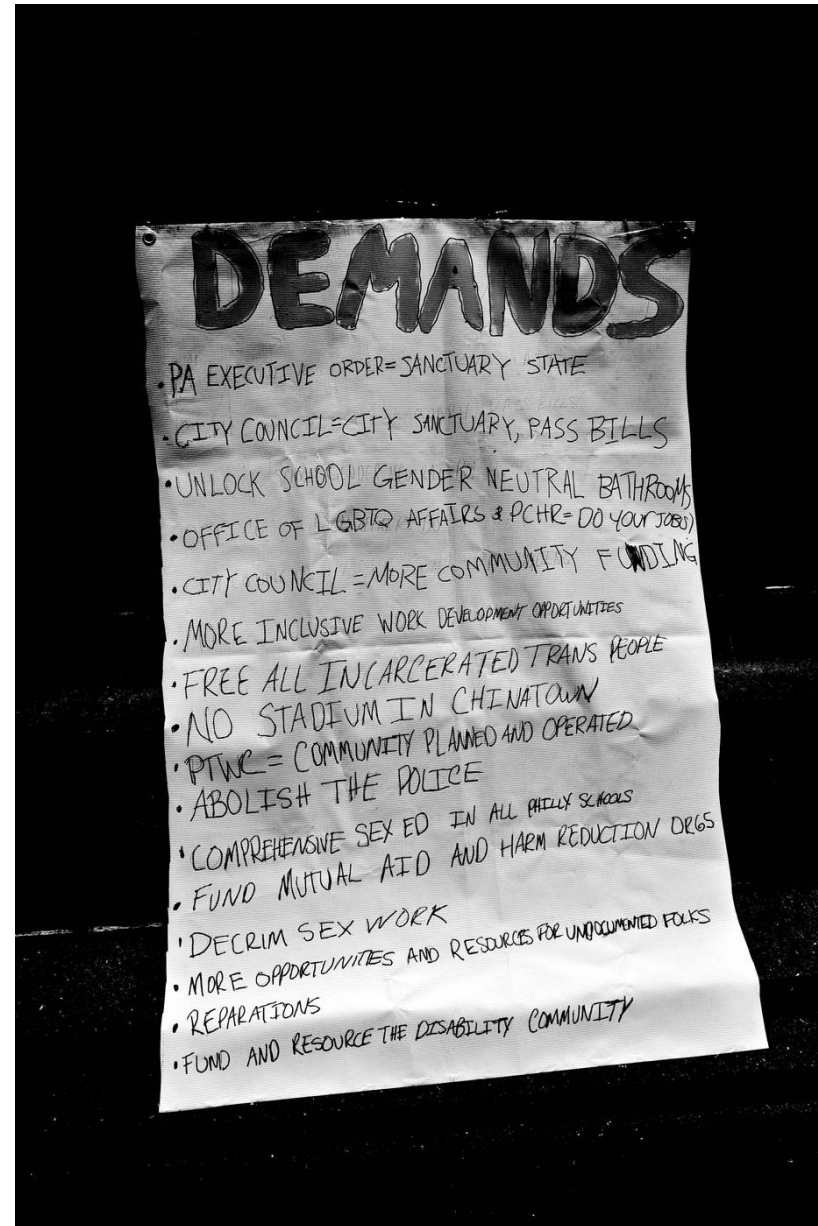










































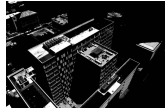
